basic industrial materials, such as, but not limited to, polymers, unmachined metal, ferrous or non-ferrous, bar stock, ingots or forgings and unshaped wood...

—————> **Does not define other materials.**

No taxation within Wyoming 6-8-404 (a)

A personal firearm, a firearm accessory or ammunition that is manufactured commercially or privately in Wyoming and that remains exclusively within the borders of Wyoming is not subject to federal law, federal taxation or federal regulation, including registration, under the authority of the United States congress to regulate interstate commerce...

—————> **Does not address taxation.**

Improved methods of marking 6-8-404 (b)

shall have the words, "made in Wyoming" clearly stamped, inscribed or otherwise marked...

—————> **Does not address other acceptable methods of marking the firearm.**

Penalties clause 6-8-405 (a) (b)

Sections creating penalties for state and federal agents enforcing or attempting to enforce

—————> **No penalties clause included**

Defense clause 6-8-405 (c)

The attorney General may defend a citizen of Wyoming...

—————> **No defense clause included**

Stronger Second Amendment Declaration 6-8-405 (iv)

The second amendment to the United States constitution reserves to the people the right to keep and bear arms as that right was understood at the time the original states ratified the bill of rights to the United States constitution...

—————> **No equal footing declaration**

Stronger Article 1 Section 24 Declaration 6-8-405 (v)

...this right shall not be denied. This right predates the United States constitution and the Wyoming constitution and is unchanged from the 1890 Wyoming constitution...

—————> **No mention of "shall not be denied" or "this right predates" or "unchanged"**

Additional State Constitutional Declarations 6-8-405 (vi) (vii)

(viii) Article 1, sections 1 and 7, of the Wyoming constitution clearly provide that the people of the state have the sole and exclusive right of governing themselves as a free, sovereign and independent state, and do so and forever hereafter shall exercise and enjoy every power, jurisdiction and right, pertaining thereto, which is not, or may not hereafter be, by them expressly delegated to the United States of America;

—————> **Not included**

Declaration of Independence cited 6-8-405 (ix)

The declaration of independence clearly provides that government derives its power directly from the consent of the governed and Wyoming affirms the language of the second paragraph of the declaration of independence which states "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by the Creator with certain inalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed..."

—————> **Not included**

Change to state law to affirm constitutional right

6.8.401 (a) The Wyoming legislature finds that the right to keep and bear arms in a fundamental right that predates the United States constitution and the Wyoming constitution. The Wyoming legislature affirms this right as a constitutionally protected right in every part of Wyoming.

—————> **Not included**

Preemption change to affirm this legislation

Change to 6.8.401 (c) no... political subdivision or any other entity shall authorize, regulate or prohibit the sale, transfer, purchase, delivery, taxation, manufacture, ownership, transportation, storage, use, carrying or possession of firearms, weapons, and accessories, components or ammunition except as specifically provided by this chapter.
